Where We've Been Hillsborough Concours d'Elegance

On July 18, Hillsborough returned after last year's COVID hiatus with gusto as it resumed its place as the longest continually running concours in the world. The show field was limited to just 200 cars, but among them were several of our members' Packards. Jack Perkins had a prime spot at the head of his class of "CCCA Approved Classics" with his 1929 626 Eight Convertible Coupe, while a few stalls away the Kerr family's 1934 1101 Eight Convertible Sedan made its concours debut. Further along, Matt Kilkenny's 1934 1107 Twelve 7-Passenger Sedan was parked alongside his father John Kilkenny's 1934 1108 Twelve Dietrich Convertible Sedan.

Nor Cal Packards also had the privilege of being asked to park a group (a gaggle? a murder? a pride!) of Packards in the car corral, and we didn't disappoint. At one point we had eight cars ranging from 1934 to 1950. It was fun to see Milt Wheeler's and Tom Beidleman's twin 1934 coupes parked alongside each other, and also to compare differences between Bruce Cumming's 110, Ron and Mary Carpenter's 120 and Dan Shanahan's 180 station wagons.

When it came time for the awards to be presented, we were proud to learn that the Kerr family took third in class with their convertible sedan! It was quite a day, and a wonderful way to get back on the field

Once a vear the world's most acclaimed Concours d'Elegance takes place on the fairways and lawns of the Pebble Beach Links. After being canceled in 2020 - a year which saw most all of our favorite events get canceled - it was a pleasure for your author to enjoy this most prestigious of Concours events

This year's selection of Finely Crafted Faberge Lawn Eggs included the expected classes for pre-war Packards, Duesenbergs, Rolls-Royce and Mercedes-Benz. In honor of the

70th anniversary of this event a special class of 40 previous "Best in Show" winners was arranged along the shores of Stillwater Cove for our enjoyment. And with collector car auctions setting records for modern sports and racing cars, Pebble Beach embraced this trend by featuring classes for the Porsche 917, La Carrera Panamericana race cars, and a special class celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Lamborghini Countach.

Given my years of involvement with the Packard Club and the CCCA, I was on a first name basis with many entrants showing pre-war Classic Cars "on the lawn." There were hushed conversations about how well their cars did in the judging, and later in the day these same people were rewarded with a drive "on the ramp" to collect class trophies.


