

Boat Tour. The museum welcomed our club with open arms, where we lined both sides of the street with Packards. Bill Davidson, great-grandson of one of the founders, greeted us with some brief remarks, and then turned us loose to see everything from the original shack where the first bikes were built to displays of significant motorcy-

cles, engines and art. We also learned about the history and struggles of one of our nation's most iconic brands.

Lake Geneva began as an escape for the rich fleeing the great Chicago fire of 1871. The Wrigleys, Palmers and other wealthy families built grand summer homes here, similar to the "cottages" of Newport, RI. While few of those original houses remain, the lake continues to be a playground for the elite. Our boat tour took us around the edge of the lake to see the grand estates while we leisurely enjoyed a gourmet lunch.

Even though we had been touring with many of the cars all week, show day always brings out the most interesting iron. One of the many great things about having the meet in a different city every year is the different cars. For example, there was quite a showing of cars from the teens—something there were less than a handful of in California last year. Other special cars included one of the very few 1941 Darrin Sport Sedans and the one-off 1952 Patrician '400' built for the New York Auto Show with unique metallic orange paint and fabric and faux fur appointments, all specially chosen by Dorothy Draper.

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
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
