A family friend of the Kimballs, Dana Staiger was a Packard owner and was an early State Ranger of the California State Park system in Big Sur. Lee had secured never-before-seen film footage capturing this historic event of June 27, 1937, including various photos of Staiger's 1936 Packard throughout its life.

The first day of the tour included a scenic drive from Morro Bay through the back roads overlooking the coast and beautiful farm country to Vandenberg Air Force Base. The group enjoyed a private tour of the base; learning the history of the base and its role in key historical events.



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
