
It is with deep regrets that we announce the passing of two members of Nor- Cal Packards.






Rod Derbyshire's '40 1800 opera coupe.









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knowledgeable park ranger, who explained the succession of peoples and land uses that preceded the area's utilization for military purposes to guard the Golden Gate. It was all finally secured in perpetuity as park land in 1972.

After a bit of shopping in the gift shop, we caravanned to the Nike Missile site for a history of the Cold War, presented by another park ranger and an awe inspiring introduction to a real Nike Missile that emerged from its underground silo and then stood straight up as if ready to take off. The sounds were amazing and made us feel as if we were in a war movie.

At our next stop we left the cars and almost everyone hiked in the area. Most went down to the Pt Bonita Lighthouse through a mountain tunnel and across a suspension bridge, taking in gorgeous views of the ocean and the Golden Gate with San Francisco pretty much shrouded in fog. Some explored some ruins of 100-year-old gun emplacements.

After a scenic drive along the cliff-hugging road overlooking the Golden Gate Bridge, we drove through Fort Baker and Sausalito and arrived at the Buckeye Roadhouse for an amazing meal in a beautiful setting. We all enjoyed visiting and the nine Packards all looked wonderful lined up facing the road.



Nor-Cal Packard members were well represented on the red awards carpet. I was fortunate to present the following awards:



Congratulations, Don, Larry and Susan for your recognition.




