There's excitement in-the-air! Spring is coming and it's now time to plan for our driving pleasure.

Jeff Mihaly is hosting a meeting at his home for the 2020 National Tour Steering Committee on March 17th. Maybe Clint will bring his "new baby", green Packard in honor of St. Patrick's Day.

Speaking of Clint, our Tour Director; he noted a "hole" in our calendar for February. Quick-as-a-wink, he put together a wonderful tour of the Bay Model in Sausalito, followed by a first-rate lunch at the Buckeye Roadhouse (see his report in this edition). This tour was the essence of serendipity (finding something cool when you're not looking for it). As we gathered for our meet-and-greet, two fellows came by to admire our cars. Come-to-find-out, they were the gate keepers for the brigantine *Matthew Turner*, a 19th century style two-mast wooden ship, under construction from the ground up. Without hesitation, we were granted access to the ship and we were given a private tour (including below deck) of the project.

Matthew Turner was a prolific ship builder in the area. He built 228 vessels of which 154 were built at the Matthew Turner Ship Yard in Benicia. He built more ships in this time than any other ship builder in America. A foundation was formed to secure Douglas Fir from the Nature Conservancy which was milled on site. This \$7 million dollar project is almost complete. The ship deck is 100 feet long with an overall length of 130 feet. It displaces 175 tons (350,000 lbs). This includes 84,000 pounds of lead placed in the ship for ballast.

With the tour of the ship, the tour of the Bay Model and a short drive to the Buckeye for lunch, who could ask for anything more? Maybe this can become a future tour.

Check the Calendar. The National Meet is July 1 thru 7 in Columbus Ohio. Our Western Regional Tour is now set for May 17 thru 20 out of Auburn with several tours to historic sites in Sacramento and around Auburn.

We're looking for ideas and tour leaders for later in the year (October). If you have a good idea, let us know. If you have not hosted a tour, we'll help!

Milton Wheeler and team have put together our second Packard Calendar (2018). Bill Young has a limited supply if you're interested. And, Bill Young, our Membership Director, will soon be mailing out our 2018 Membership Directory. Thanks to them for the unselfish time they commit to our projects.

Lastly, the Pierce Arrow Club is hosting their National Tour this summer in Rohnert Park, Hilton. This is a great opportunity for our Club to observe a National Meet at the hotel where our 2020 Meet is scheduled.

STEVE MESSENGER 1936 - 2018

Edwin Stephen Messenger, "Steve", passed away on January 30, 2018. He was the former owner of "Just Packards". A lifelong Packard enthusiast, Steve excelled in his mechanical ability to restore Packard automobiles to factory standards. Born in Martinez, Calif, Steve's early trades were as a tile setter, a refrigeration specialist and electrician. But it was his love of Packard in the mid 50's that quickly earned him the notoriety of the "go to" guy for Packard repairs. Superb engine rebuilding along with R9 and R11 transmissions rebuilds were his forte. Complete electrical rewiring was another specialty. He even configured a 1942-180 with electric windows! Steve spent many hours over the phone with other Packard owners nationwide in resolving their problems with his expertise and knowledge. Steve was a proud veteran who served his county in the Air force and was a compassionate cat owner all his life. The Packard world has lost a true master mechanic, friend and mentor to us all. - Roark Diters

Where We've Been Army Corps Bay Model

Built in the 1950's as a way to research the effects landfill and dam proposals would have on our environment, the model now is a center for education and outreach since computer modeling now more effectively and efficiently predicts potential benefits and detriments to our fragile bay environment.

Back out in the parking lot, we fired up our classics and made the short drive to the restaurant. With its cozy atmosphere and welcoming fireplace, the Buckeye Roadhouse has been a popular stop and watering hole along Highway 101 for over 80 years. The restaurant was prepared for us with saved spaces in the parking lot and a group of waiting tables. Fast and friendly servers delivered delicious dishes, such as pork chops, crab cakes and burgers to our hungry group. A great way to end our day together!


